


If your student takes an Honors Science class, they will be required to complete an independent project.

MATH ACCELERATION







Earning Credit for Grade 8 Mathmematics

Want to accelerate from 6th Grade Advanced Math to 7th Grade Algebra 1?

OR

Want to accelerate from 7th Grade Level Math to 8th Grade Algebra 1?

You must have credit for Math 8 first!

Students have the following options to earn credit for Math 8:

Credit By Examination

Conroe ISD will administer the Math 8 CBE on home campuses the week of February 21st— February 24th. Students must register in advance in order to take the test by completing the application form and submitting by January 26, 2023. No late registrations will be accepted. There is no charge for this exam. Students earning an 80 or higher on the CBE will earn credit for Math 8 and will be placed in Algebra 1 the following school year.

Students who do not earn the required cut off score but still want to pursue taking Algebra 1 the following year may choose to take the 8th grade course during summer school.

OR

Conroe ISD offers courses for initial credit during the summer. Students that successfully complete the 8th Grade Math course with an 80 or higher will earn credit for Math 8 and will be placed in Algebra 1 the following school year. There is a fee associated with this course (scholarships available). Two opportunities may be available. One offering will run from April to July and the second opportunity will run from June to July. Students will have to complete lessons at home via the internet and during their face-to-face classes with an instructor. Information will be posted on the Conroe ISD website. Please note that there are strict attendance guidelines associated with this course. Registration guidance will be provided by the student's counselor.

Other Recommendations

Want to accelerate from 6th Grade Level Math to 7th Grade Pre-Algebra?

These courses have <u>open enrollment</u>, however, students in 6th grade level math are not exposed to any 7th grade material and are skipping an entire year of content. It is recommended (but not required) that students take the Conroe ISD 7th grade math in the summer as an accelerated math initial credit course to be prepared for Algebra 1. Two opportunities may be available contingent on availability of staff and demand. A fee is associated with this course (scholarships are available). These courses will be offered during the summer school window for initial credit. Students will complete lessons both at home via the internet and during face-to-face instruction with a math teacher. Information will be posted on the Conroe ISD website. Summer school, advanced math courses have strict attendance guidelines and registration guidance will be provided by the child's counselor.

CHOOSING ELECTIVES

OFF-CAMPOS PE

- The purpose of the Off-Campus Physical Education Program is to accommodate students who are making a serious effort to develop high- level skills in a specific activity that exceeds what the school district can offer through general PE programs.
- Facility is to be in a partnership with Conroe ISD.
- Category 1- Participation includes a minimum of 15 hours per week. Student is dismissed early to participate in Off-Campus PE program.
- Category 2- Participation includes a minimum of 5 hours per week. Student is NOT dismissed early and will receive PE credit from Off- Campus program.
 Student will not participate in PE at Irons rather have another elective in its place.
- Deadline for enrollment to Off Campus PE Program is May 1st.

CELL PHONES & ELECTRONICS

Junior High School Cell Phone and Smartwatch Guidelines Adopted by CISD School Board:

- Cell phones and smartwatches may be used respectfully and responsibly before school and after school.
- Cell phones and smartwatches should be set on silent mode and be kept in the designated storage area during class time (e.g. backpacks, cell phone caddy, or lockers), and should not be visible during instructional time.
- Cell phones should not be used for reward time or free time.

- Cell phones and smartwatches should remain in the designated storage area when students leave the classroom during class time.
