

#### WHO SHOULD TAKE HONORS CLASSES?


#### **ADVANCED PATHWAYS FOR ALGEBRA I**

#### Who should be considered for 7th Grade PreAlgebra?

- Students who access math at a quicker pace and have good problem-solving skills.
- Students with a strong number sense or fluency (manipulate numbers mentally).

The following data sources should be considered when recruiting students for accelerated math or placing them in Advanced Mathematics:

- Evidence of number sense or fluency
- Common Formative Assessment Results
- Fall Interim STAAR Scores (Projected Meets or Masters)
- Spring Interim STAAR Scores (Projected Meets or Masters)
- Previous STAAR Math and Reading Scores



\*7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Algebra 1- students have to successfully pass the 8<sup>th</sup> grade credit-by-exam (CBE) or successfully pass PreAlgebra. Students are recommended to take at least four math courses in high school and at least one Approved Advanced Level Mathematics course their senior year. \*\*7<sup>th</sup> Grade PreAlgebra Honors - This course is available to incoming 7th grade students enrolled in 6<sup>th</sup> grade Advanced Mathematics or attended summer school for 7<sup>th</sup> grade instruction. Students will take the 8th Grade STAAR Test in May.

\*\*\*7<sup>th</sup> Grade PreAlgebra - This course has open enrollment for On-Level sixth grade students opting to advance in mathematics at the junior high level. Students will take the 8<sup>th</sup> Grade STAAR test in May.



## HIGH SCHOOL CREDIT COURSES

Art I (one credit)	Must have completed Art A and B.		
Spanish I (one credit)	Must have an 80 or above in Language Arts		
Spanish II NS (two credits) Spanish for Native Speakers	Must pass the placement exam.		





## CHOOSING ELECTIVES

OR

Students will choose:

4 one semester electives (2 each semester) 1 full year elective (ex. Band, Orchestra or Choir) and/or 2 full years (ex. Band & Yearbook, or INN & Choir) *Or* 2 one semester electives

Placement in electives is determined by choice, availability and flexibility with other courses.

• Electives <u>will not</u> be changed during the school year



## STAAR ENRICHMENT

- For students who need extra help in preparing for the Math or Reading STAAR tests
- Students will be <u>required</u> to take a semester STAAR Enrichment Course if not successful on the STAAR test.

#### This is mandated by the state of Texas to help fill gaps.

## OFF-CAMPUS PE

- The purpose of the Off -Campus Physical Education Program is to accommodate students who are making a serious effort to develop high- level skills in a specific activity that exceeds what the school district can offer through general PE programs.
- Facility is to be in a partnership with Conroe ISD.
- Category 1- Participation includes a minimum of 15 hours per week. Student is dismissed early to participate in Off - Campus PE program.
- Category 2 Participation includes a minimum of 5 hours per week. Student is NOT dismissed early and will receive PE credit from Off Campus program. Student will not participate in PE at Irons rather have another elective in its place.
- Deadline for enrollment to Off Campus PE Program is May 1

st .

## SCHOOL GUIDELINES

#### **Dress Code**
